Essential Information

Included in your pilgrimage: Your pilgrimage will include transportation to and from Fall River by private, air-conditioned motor coach, all entrance fees where applicable as per itinerary, beautiful hotels for all nights, breakfast and dinner provided daily and gratuities for the dinner service. Not included are passport fees, items of a personal nature, laundry, lunches, and personal gratuities.

Documents required: All United States citizens require a valid passport, but do not require a visa for travel in Canada. Non-U.S. citizens must check entry requirements with their respective consulates.

Subject to change: This program is planned in advance, and therefore circumstances beyond our control may require that some changes be made in the actual tour operations; such as changing days of sightseeing, or substituting some sight that may be closed for another that is open. We reserve the right to vary the itinerary and substitute components of the tour program.

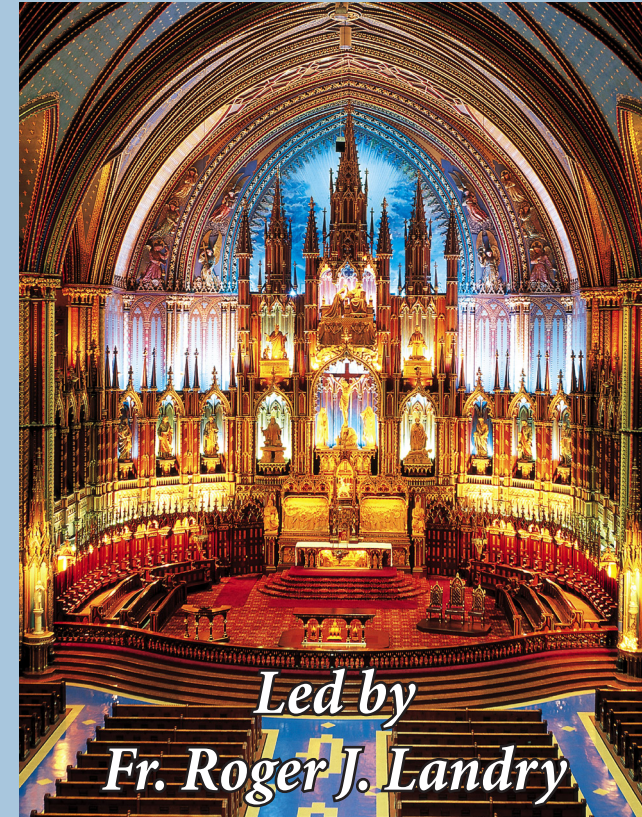
Cost and Payment: The cost of the pilgrimage is \$999 per person double-occupancy. There is a supplemental charge of \$248 (\$1,147) for single room occupancy and a \$53 reduction (\$946) for those who choose to have a triple room. The \$999 cost is determined based on 40 pilgrims. If fewer than 40 sign up by March 19, the pilgrimage will either be cancelled (with a full refund) or the pilgrims will agree to pay a supplement to cover the distribution of extra average costs for the bus and other overhead expenses.

Payment: A deposit of \$250 is needed to secure a spot on the pilgrimage. It is very important to send in your deposit immediately as space is limited. The final payment of an additional \$749 is due by March 19, 2014. Please make your checks or money orders payable to "Cosmos Travel" and mail with this reservation form to **Halley Badger, Cosmos Travel, 5301 South Federal Circle, Littleton, CO 80123.** You may also pay by credit card.

Refund Policy: Prior to March 19, your \$250 deposit is refundable. After March 19, it is non-refundable but transferable to someone else to take your place on the pilgrimage. The rest of what you have paid is refundable.

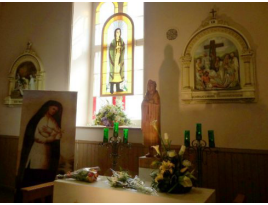

Overview of Itinerary

Thursday, May 1, Departure for Montreal – At 6 am, we will have a brief prayer in St. Bernadette's Church before departing by full air-conditioned motorcoach to Montreal.

We will have Mass at the tomb of one of the most recent and lovable American saints St. Kateri Tekakwitha at St. Francis Xavier Church in the Indian Reservation of Kahnawake, just south of Montreal, where she had escaped

after her family was seeking to kill her for converting to Christianity. After Mass, we will have a brief visit of the Museum and bookstore attached to the Church and then we will make the short journey across the St. Lawrence seaway to Montreal to visit St. Joseph's Oratory, the largest shrine in the world dedicated to St. Joseph,

built through the tireless efforts of St. André Bessette, who was a regular visitor of Fall River and New Bedford during his lifetime. May 1 is the feast day of St. Joseph the

Worker and so it is a tremendous day to visit and pray at the Shrine.

From there we will go to our hotel to check in, relax and have dinner.

Friday, May 2, Montreal – After breakfast in the hotel, we will head to the Basilica of Notre Dame, one of the most breathtakingly beautiful Churches in the world. We will celebrate Mass and then have a guided tour of the basilica, leaving time afterward for personal prayer or shopping. Lunch will be on your own in one of the many eateries in downtown Montreal. In the afternoon, we will visit the Cathedral of St. James-Mary

Margaret Bourgeoys. Dinner included at our hotel.

Saturday, May 3, Cap de la Madeleine: After breakfast at the hotel and check out, we will head on a two-hour Saturday Marian pilgrimage to the principal Marian shrine in all of Canada, Notre Dame de Cap de la Madeleine, in Three Rivers. There we will have Mass at the Shrine where John Paul II (who will have been canonized six days before!) celebrated Mass in 1984. Those who are hungry will have



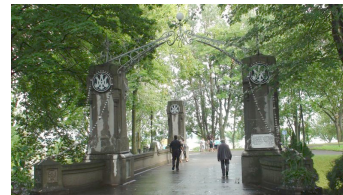
Interior of Montreal Cathedral modeled on St. Peter's Basilica

a chance to have a simple lunch in the cafeteria of the shrine. We will have a chance to pray the Rosary as a group on the exquisitely beautiful grounds of the sanctuary, one of the most spectacular Rosary Walks of any place in the world. After time for personal prayer and shopping, we will make the two-hour trip to Quebec City to check in to our hotel and to have dinner. After dinner, those who have energy and interest can have a walking tour of old Quebec City at night, by far the most "European place" in North America.

Sunday May 4, St. Anne de Beaupré: After breakfast at the hotel, we will head to the Shrine of St. Anne de Beaupré, about 20 miles outside of Quebec City.

Queen of the World, which was built to be a one-third replica of St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican. Time permitting we will visit the beautiful Gothic Church of St. Patrick's, built by and for the Irish Catholics in Montreal as well as the Church housing the tomb of St.

After Guadalupe, this Shrine is the most famous place of pilgrimage on our continent. Housing some of the relics of the grandmother of God, it features an incredibly majestic Upper Church, a splendid crypt Church with very compelling modern art that brings the saints alive, a tremendous bookstore (with the best French genealogical books you'll find anywhere), the largest stations of the Cross in North America (based on Lourdes, France), a cyclorama with a huge model of Jerusalem, and so much more. Lunch will be on your own on the grounds. On our way home we will stop for a bit at Montgomery Falls, one of the most impressive cataract falls in North America. Dinner will be at the hotel.

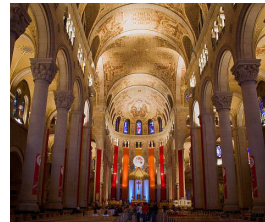


Notre Dame Cathedral in Quebec City, recently refurbished!

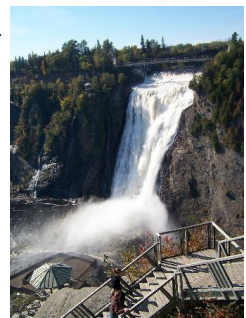


St. Anne de Beaupré
