




# Blessed Pope John Paul II By Father Christopher Mahar

Blessed John Paul II, beatified in 2011, will be canonized the Sunday after the Seminar. Father Mahar is Rector of Our Lady of Providence Seminary in Providence, Rhode Island. He will focus on Fr. Karol Wojtyla's priestly example, writings about the priesthood and counsels to brother priests.

### Blessed Pope John XXIII By Father Roger Landry

John XXIII, beatified in 2000, will be canonized the Sunday after the Seminar. Father Landry is pastor of St. Bernadette Parish in Fall River and national chaplain for Catholic Voices USA. He will focus on Fr. Angelo Roncalli's priestly virtues that made him such a beloved pope.




#### Servant of God Patrick Peyton By Father John Phalen, CSC

Father Peyton, the famous "Rosary Priest" and founder of the Family Rosary Crusade, Family Theater, and Holy Cross Family Ministries, had his cause introduced in 2001. Father Phalen is his successor as President of Holy Cross Family Ministries, based in Easton, MA.

#### Venerable Alvaro del Portillo By Monsignor James Kelly

The Venerable Alvaro del Portillo will be beatified September 27, 2014 in Madrid. He was the first Prelate of Opus Dei and the Successor of St. Josemaria. He was the secretary for the Commission that wrote *Presbyterorum* Ordinis. Msgr. Kelly, a priest of Opus Dei in California, was his English secretary for many years.



#### Blessed Jerzy Popieluszko and Blessed Giuseppe Puglisi By Father Raymond DeSouza

Bl. Jerzy Popieluszko was martyred at the age of 37 by the Communists in Poland in 1984 and beatified in 2010. Blessed Giuseppe "Dino" Puglisi was martyred on his 56th birthday by the mafia in Sicily. Both were killed in the context of doing their priestly pastoral work. Their examples will be considered together by Fr. DeSouza, pastor of Sacred Heart of Mary Parish on Wolfe Island, Chaplain at Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario, well-known writer, editor of *Convivium* and consultor to the US Bishops.





## Servant of God Walter Ciszek, SJ By Msgr. Anthony Muntone

Father Walter Ciszek, a native of Shenandoah, PA, spent 23 years imprisoned in brutal Soviet prisons for clandestine missionary work. His books *With God in Russia* and *He Leadeth Me* are spiritual classics. Msgr. Muntone, a priest of the Diocese of Allentown, is one of the foremost experts on Fr. Ciszek's life, thought and work.

#### Seminar Details

- Registration is limited to 70 priests and transitional deacons, so priests are encouraged to register as early as possible. Priests may initially reserve a spot by sending an email to rogerlandry@post.harvard.edu and then by filling out and mailing the cut out section to the right. Registration is confirmed when payment is received.
- The Seminar begins Easter Monday, April 21, at 4 pm. Attendees may start arriving at 2 pm. The cost of the Seminar is \$200, which includes all great Easter-meals and lodging.
- There is no Mass scheduled for Monday, but if priests need to celebrate Mass because of travel, arrangements will be made. On Tuesday, there will be a concelebrated Mass at 11:30. On Wednesday there will be a concelebrated Mass at 8 am. The Seminar will finish after a 9 am breakfast. There will be the option to celebrate private Masses for priests who wish. Lauds, Vespers and Compline are prayed each day in common. Eucharistic adoration will also take place. On Tuesday and Wednesday there will be preached meditations offered and the availability of the Sacrament of Penance.
- The Seminar is sponsored by the New England Theological Forum, an educational service of the priests of the Prelature of Opus Dei and the Priestly Society of the Holy Cross in the dioceses of New England.
